


## TRAFALGAR

Trafalgar Tours is organising a fully escorted Quarry Industry Study Tour in April 2007 to Germany and France for members of the quarry industry and their partners. The tour is planned to have two distinct stages. During the first stage you will visit the facilities of three major suppliers to the quarry industry; Komatsu, Orica and Liebherr. In the second stage you will participate in BAUMA 2007.



The Komatsu factory in Hanover, Germany, builds small and medium-sized wheel loaders, mini wheel loaders and compactors and is the primary source of these machines for the Australian market. The tour party will be taken on a guided tour of the factory and see first hand how Komatsu build their machines.



The European headquarters for Orica is located at Troisdorf near Cologne, Germany. The tour party will be given an insight into the blasting practices applied in Europe and the future direction of quarry blasting.



The Liebherr factory in Colmar, France, builds a wide range of hydraulic crawler excavators and shovels, with service weights between 20 and 670 metric tons and is the source of these machines for the Australian market. The tour party will be taken on a guided tour of the factory and see first hand how Liebherr build their machines.



BAUMA is the world's largest and probably the most important trade fair for the construction and construction materials industries. Established 50 years ago, it presents a comprehensive international product range in the area of construction machinery, construction equipment and vehicles and mining machines. BAUMA is a hub for international business and an important venue for gathering information and establishing contacts, where building and construction experts from all over the world can inform themselves about state-of-the-art technology.

BAUMA features machinery and equipment for building construction, civil construction for manufacturers and suppliers of building and construction materials. This includes machinery and equipment for: raw materials extraction and handling; sand & aggregate processing; and concrete and bituminous materials batching, delivery and placement.

In 2004 a total of 2,801 exhibitors from 47 countries made use of BAUMA as a platform for presentation and marketing. The proportion of exhibitors from abroad increased by 26 per cent compared to 2001. Over 416,000 visitors came to Munich for BAUMA 2004, with 29 per cent of these from abroad. BAUMA 2007 will occupy in excess of 500,000m<sup>2</sup> of indoor and outdoor exhibition space and showcase an even larger number of exhibitors.

The target groups for BAUMA are producers, suppliers and service providers from the construction and building materials industries.

Upon arrival at the airport, you will be met by your Trafalgar Tour Director before we transfer to former Free Imperial Town of Goslar, where we stay for two nights. The town's history dates back to the discovery of silver and copper ore deposits back in the 11th Century and today its cobble stoned streets and impressive buildings are listed on the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List. The day is yours at leisure to explore. Tonight, meet for a welcome drink and dinner at the hotel. **Hotel: Ramada Goslar (D)**

### DAY 3 – 16 APR: KOMATSU & HANOVER

This morning you will travel to Hanover, where you will be taken on a guided tour of the Komatsu factory to see first hand how their products are manufactured. Komatsu builds small and medium sized wheel loaders, mini wheel loaders and compactors and is the primary sources of these products on the Australian

market. After morning tea and lunch is provided, you will have free time to explore the city of Hanover, a place almost totally rebuilt following World War II. Perhaps you could check out the viewing platform at the top of the Town Hall (Rathaus) for an aerial view of the city. Then it's time to head back to Goslar where your evening is at leisure. (BB,L)

**DAY 4 – 17 APR: GOSLAR TO LEVERKUSEN**

Enjoy our journey through the lower Saxony region before a lunch stop in Kassel. You have time to see the city's famous sights including the unusual Museum of Death, a Roman Aqueduct or the massive Hercules monument. We arrive for our two night stop in Leverkusen, where dinner is provided at the hotel tonight. **Hotel: Best Western Leverkusen** (BB,D)

**DAY 5 – 18 APR: ORICA & COLOGNE**

First today we take a trip to visit the Orica factory, where a guided tour will provide an insight into the blasting practices applied in Europe, and the future direction of quarry blasting. It's then time to head to Cologne, Germany's oldest city with innumerable cultural and historical treasures, world famous museums and an active arts scene where you have free time to explore. After time for dinner, we will return to our hotel. (BB)

**DAY 6 – 19 APR: LEVERKUSEN TO COLMAR**

Our journey this morning takes us through the scenic Rhine Valley and taking time to visit the university town of Heidelberg on the lovely Neckar River. We then cross the border into France, to the colourful Alsatian town of Colmar where we will spend the next two nights. Dinner will be provided at the hotel. **Hotel: Amiral** (BB,D)

**DAY 7 – 20 APR: LIEBHERR & COLMAR**

Today you will visit the Liebherr factory, manufacturers of hydraulic crawler excavators and shovels, where you will be taken on a guided tour. This afternoon, join your Tour Director for an orientation tour of Colmar. This evening is free to sample the local cuisine. (BB)

**DAY 8 – 21 APR: COLMAR TO OBERAMMERGAU**


Travelling this morning back into Germany, our lunch stop will be at Friedrichshafen, famous for its Zeppelin Museum. We arrive in Oberammergau, famous for its wood carvers and the Passion Play which happens every ten years, where we will stay for five nights. Tonight, enjoy an included dinner at the hotel. **Hotel: Wittelsbach** (BB,D)

**DAY 9 – 22 APR: OBERAMMERGAU OR INNSBRUCK**

Today is free to spend as you desire. You have the option of taking a day trip on the coach to the Austrian alpine town of Innsbruck, home of the 1964 Winter Olympics. Alternatively, you may wish to take public transport to the Bavarian town of Garmisch-Partenkirchen. Or simply take the time to enjoy the surroundings of Oberammergau. (BB)

**DAY 10 – 23 APR: BAUMA & MUNICH**

This morning, you will be transported to the Bauma 2007 trade fair in Munich. The day is yours to see the 2,801 exhibitors from 47 countries in the world's largest trade fair for the construction and construction materials industry. Tonight, you may be treated to a night at a traditional Bavarian beer hall for dinner and entertainment. (BB)



**DAY 11 – 24 APR: OBERAMMERGAU OR FUSSEN**

The choice is yours to today. There is the option to return to the Bauma exhibition in Munich by coach. Otherwise, you may take the option of visiting Fussen, the home of Mad King Ludwig's fairytale Neuschwanstein castle. On the return journey, you will also view another beautiful castle complex at Linderhof. (BB)

**DAY 12 – 25 APR: BAUMA & MUNICH**

Today is your opportunity to visit the Bauma trade fair once again in Munich. This evening, you will be treated to a night out including dinner at the Paulaner beer hall in Munich, courtesy of Volvo. (BB,D)

**DAY 13 – 26 APR: DEPART MUNICH**

This morning we will travel to the medieval gem of Rothenburg, a town of cobbled lanes and picturesque houses. In the afternoon, you will be transferred to Munich Airport for your journey home. (BB)

### TAXES AND LEVIES



