The quarry industry takes pride in the professionalism of its members and each year the Institute of Quarrying NZ Inc (IOQ) offers awards to recognise excellence in numerous categories. The Awards are presented at the Quarry NZ Conference held annually in July.



Winstone Aggregates Safety Award

Safety of people at a quarry site, both staff and visitors, is paramount. Each year this Safety Award is presented to the quarry operation **judged the best for 'meeting a wide range of safety criteria relating to the industry'**.

Nominations can be made by any Branch of the IOQ New Zealand in writing and must be supported with detailed reasons for the nomination. Applications should reach the IOQ National Secretary by 30 April, to ensure that the judging panel has sufficient time to visit each of the nominated quarry sites.

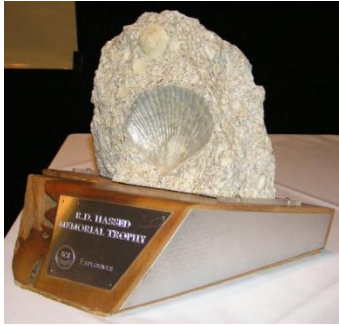
This most coveted trophy is presented through the IOQ NZ Inc by Winstone Aggregates and is in the form of a large mounted crystal.

Southern Cross Engineering-Rocktec Innovation Award



The SCE-Rocktec innovation award of \$3,500 is offered annually. The award is to assist the member to further his or her knowledge of the quarrying industry for their benefit and that of the Institute of Quarrying NZ (Inc.). The award is to **recognise a member's contribution to innovation in the quarry industry**. This may include innovation in any area of quarry operations including production, operations, plant design, maintenance or processes. The member would use the travel award to view operations, enhancements, automation, plant design and services and maintenance that are innovative or being used to improve quarrying efficiencies, production or operation practices with a view to sharing these ideas within his/her own business and the industry. "The striking glass award is inscribed and is the recipients to keep".

R D Hassed Award



This trophy is awarded annually to a New Zealand member of the Institute **who has made the most outstanding contribution to the Branch during the current year**. Nominations for this award can be made by any member of the Institute or any group committee. This trophy remains the property of the IoQ NZ and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation at the Institute's NZ Annual Conference normally held in July each year.

The trophy is a piece of limestone containing a scallop shell fossil from Pakipaki Quarry in Hawkes Bay, and is mounted on a wooden base.

Lyn Jordan Memorial Trophy



This award is for the **"Best Technical Paper"** given at an **Institute Branch Meeting or the Quarry NZ Annual Conference**. The award is in memory of the late Lyn Jordan who was an early member of the IOQ NZ Inc and is in the form of a vintage exploder donated by the Explosives Division of ICI NZ Ltd (now Orica). The trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation.

Niemac Award (not available in 2018)



This award recognises **personal achievement by an IOQ member working as a quarry plant operator or engineer or manager**. The intent is to reward a person directly responsible for significant development or engineering, in plant operation, plant maintenance, or in problem-solving in the industry. This award is an opportunity to reward an achiever who may not necessarily be conspicuous within the industry.

This award is a model Jaw Crusher trophy with an inscribed plaque, which is donated by Niemac and given to the recipient to keep.

Porter Equipment Quarry Leadership Award (every second year commencing 2014)



This award is presented to **an Institute member who has achieved 10 or more years membership and who holds a management position within the quarrying industry.**

This prestigious award offers an all-expenses paid 5 day trip to Korea to visit the Hyundai Factory hosted by Porter Equipment and will be presented every two years.

B R Webster Family Educational Scholarship

The Scholarship is awarded to individuals who are studying towards qualifications in the quarrying industry and who want to advance their tertiary study or practical learning but have limited ability to pay, or who do not have the support of their employer. If you already have some qualifications and believe you would further benefit from the scholarship then you may also apply. It is preferred that this study is carried out through MITO.

Individuals who receive the scholarship are also granted Student level Membership to the Institute of Quarrying for the first year, if they are not already a member of the IOQNZ.

RJ & AJ Loader Sponsors Shield



This award in the form of a shield donated by Andy & Raewyn Loader is for **the best sponsor's display judged annually at the Quarry NZ Conference.** The trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ Inc and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation.

Additional Awards & Citations



The INSTITUTE OF QUARRYING NZ AWARD is very much the 'members award' and awarded by IOQ NZ to **formally recognise both a long-serving member who is held in high regard because of a long period of outstanding service to the Institute, and/or a retiring President at the end of his tenure on the Executive Council.** This Award is, above all, a

measure of the esteem in which the nominee is held by his colleagues, and is made in the true spirit of Institute fellowship.

A CITATION is similar to the IOQNZ Award except that it formally recognises a long-serving member who has not held a position on the Executive Council.

HONORARY FELLOWS are elected by the NZ Executive Council and will be a person who has rendered such service to the Institute or the industry generally as warrants honorary fellowship and who has:

- i) made a significant contribution to the Institute or to the industry, or
- ii) holds a position in the Institute or the Industry which merits such recognition.

The CAERNARFON AWARD is presented annually for the **best paper given at an Institute conference, seminar, meeting etc anywhere in the world which is adjudged to have contributed the most to the advancement of some aspect of the industry - either technical, environmental or strategic etc.**

Originally, the Caernarfon Award was endowed by the North Wales branch and it is named after the town where the very first Institute meeting took place in 1917. The award has been made by Council in the UK in the past, but in 1998, responsibility for the adjudication was assumed by the International Presidents' Committee.
