Annual Conference

The Institutes annual conference was held on the 9-11 of July in Queenstown. Queenstown is located in the south island and a very popular ski resort. Our conference was attended by 350 delegates, their partners and our industry suppliers/sponsors. The conference was a great success and I invite you to join us at Wairaki in 2004. Educational Trust

This year we received a very generous donation from the Webster family to set up an Educational Trust to assist members of the Institute of Quarrying with their educational advancement. The key criteria for this scholarship is to assist an individual gain qualifications were he or she does not have the financial support of their employer.

Each year up to five scholarships will be provided for in conjunction with our training provider EXITO.

Extractive Industry Training Organisation (EXITO)

EXITO have announced a proposal for a quarry industry package supported by the IOQ to be introduced to secondary schools for 5th form students. This new initiative has already received favourable support.

Currently EXITO has 1850 trainees signed on with 1487 actively training. This shows well over 50% of our industry is actively training with trends over the last year showing a steady increase.

Jim Macdonald Memorial Award Lecture

This memorial lecture is held biannually to mark the services of the late Jim Macdonald. "Mac" to anyone who knew him. The lectures are used to promote new ideas within the industry. This years lecture will be presented by Ian Rodgers, General Manager of Metso Minerals and will be on the development and history of the "BarMac".

Accident Statistics

I am pleased to report that accidents in the surface extractive industries in New Zealand during the 2002 calendar year have shown a significant drop in the frequency rate (2.94 / 1 million man-hours to 2.15) as well as a slight drop in numbers from 21 to 19.

Regrettably, however there were 19 serious harm accidents and two fatalities in 2002.

In the three-year summary of accidents it is clear that manual handling and working with machinery needs to be given more attention.
