## **BRANCH REPORTS**

### **Otago, Southland & Canterbury IOQ Branch visit to Oamaru Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> April**

Saturday morning dawned bright and sunny and was a perfect autumn day for a site visit to Oamaru by IOQ NZ Members and other invited guests from around the lower South Island. Gavin Hartley had organised a bus from Dunedin and Fulton Hogan Central loaned their minivan for the guys to travel from Central Otago. Andrew Mahan and Brian Docherty made the effort and travelled from Christchurch to represent the Canterbury Branch.

Everybody arrived in Road Metals main depot around 10.30am and then it was all on the bus for a site visit to Oamaru Shingle Supplies Hilderthorpe Quarry and Block Plant. This site is a joint venture between Fulton & Hogan Ltd and Firth Industries situated approx eighteen kilometres north of Oamaru alongside SH 1. There was time for a cup of tea and plenty to nibble on and a general get to know everyone thanks to Oamaru Shingle Supplies.

Quarry Manager, Malcolm Vince, gave a guided tour of the Quarry Site, the borrow area located across the other side of Seven Mile Rd and the various Crushing and Sand & Aggregate Plants located on site. There was in depth explanation of how all the various sands and gravels are produced. Newly appointed Company Manager, Gary Williams, gave a run down on how the Block Plant operated and the daily and annual production of this side of the business. Oamaru Shingle Supplies also operate another Block Plant based in Fulton & Hogan's Parkburn Quarry at Cromwell to supply part of the Central Otago and Southland markets.

It was then back on the bus and off to another Quarry Site just past Weston on the western side of Oamaru. This was to the Parkside Quarry which is famous New Zealand wide for the production of a very popular building product, Oamaru Stone.

Thanks to Manager, Bob Wilson and digger operator, Shayne King, we were able to see the 30 tonne

excavator complete with a massive hydraulic saw cut the raw material into manageable sized blocks. This work used to be carried out in the past by steam powered saws that ran along railway tracks that required shifting and setting up for each and every cut. We were then free to look around and through the various cutting and processing rooms that make up the rest of the Oamaru Stone production plant that processes all the various shapes and sizes that are sold to the building industry and to the public.

Next was to have a look and walk through owner Joe Mitchell's various and numerous sheds. There is something there for everyone from the latest Cat 770 model dump truck, Cat D8R Dozer, Cat 966G Loader along with a wide range of earlier model equipment that has been used on this site over many years. A range of early model Cat D8s and the tow behind rippers that have ripped the raw material for the Lime Quarry side of the business take up some of the shed space along with a lot of other history from a bygone era. In another large size shed is a reasonable sized truck fleet and a range of agricultural equipment to keeps the farming side of business in action.

Everyone very interested in the operation of the large stone saw.

We then take the bus up to the top of the hill to have a look over the site for the proposed new Holcim Cement Plant that will hopefully become Parkside Quarries new neighbour in the near future.

We have a look past the crushing plant that is used to crush raw lime material into "track rock" especially for the growing number of cow lanes appearing in the local area as the local irrigation schemes are extended and the dairy industry flourishes. On down the hill on the south side and we travel past the processing plant that produces

agriculture lime for the farming sector. Overall this an extremely interesting site to visit with a wide range of activities and modern Cat equipment contrasted with truckloads of history to look at and enjoy.

It is time then to head back to Road Metals Oamaru Depot where the barbeque is hot and the refreshments are cold. Plenty of food and beverage lead to a very pleasant and social afternoon. It was great to see some of our more senior members socialising with the up and coming generation. The likes of John Fulton, Churchie Walls, Trevor Tamblyn and Roddy Maxwell have such a huge number of years of experience and knowledge between them and it was a pleasure to have them alongside our younger guys for the day, all enjoying the day's activities. ## Workers' skills recognised



Extra study for the past three years has earned Daniel Mudgway & Dion Leach national recognition for work skills they have gained.

They were presented with their Extractive Industries awards by Hauraki District Council Mayor John Tregidga as part of a National Industry Training Work Day held at HG Leach & Co, where they have both worked for three years. The day was held in many industries throughout New Zealand on Thursday, 1 May 2008, to help raise awareness among the wider public as to what Industry Training Organisations (ITO) are about.

Industry Training Federation executive director Jeremy Baker said industry training is a way to

improve the skill level of the country's workforce with trainees earning nationally recognised qualifications. "Studies have shown productivity increases by 20 percent when people are hooked onto the programme," he said.

HG Leach & Co run four quarry sites, the Tirohia landfill and refuse transfer stations. These sites have 23 ITO trainees and six Extractive Industry Modern Apprentices. Extractives ITO (EXITO) training coordinator Cathrine Venrooy said H G Leach & Co employed one third of the modern apprentices registered with EXITO. Achievements at HG Leach include National Certificates in Extractive Industries Introduction, Operations & Supervision with five staff working toward the National Certificate in First Line Management (Level 4). Landfill and transfer station staff are working towards achieving the National Certificate in Resource Recovery Operations. Training takes place on and off the job and is assessed by an EXITO registered Workplace assessor.

### Recruitment in a tight NZ labour Market –

With unemployment currently sitting at 3.4% finding new and suitable employees is becoming more and more difficult for businesses across a range of sectors.

### How to attract them in the first place –

Building a strong employer brand will be increasingly important for organisations to attract and retain staff as pressure on the labour market continues. A brand needs to be uniform across all mediums of communication that a business uses, eg. sharp advertising, a professional website. This type of branding is key for Generation Y job seekers who base their impression of a prospective employer on the look and feel. Businesses also need to be more open to employing diverse types of staff to counter staff shortages; people with a disability, people who have English as a second language or mature people.

### Retaining staff –

Attracting new employees is only half the problem, employers also need to keep those they already have by offering an appealing mix of work, salary, benefits and culture that is unique to their business. The trick in this tough and competitive labour market is to be proactively offering market rates around salary and benefits and then provide an edge by promoting aspects of the company that make it unique and special, eg. flexible working hours.

The labour market is changing rapidly and has new and perhaps even bigger challenges ahead than the current skill shortage.
